Smoke Alarm Requirements – TenancyServices

New requirements for Smoke Alarms in Residential Rental Properties Come into Force 1 July 2016.

- Do the new requirements apply to my rental property? If your residential rental
 property is covered by the Residential Tenancies Act (RTA) the new requirements
 apply.
- **Do I have to have smoke alarms in my rental property?** Yes, there must be at least one working smoke alarm in each bedroom or within 3 metres of each bedroom door.
- In self-contained caravans, sleep outs or similar there must be a minimum of one working smoke alarm.
- In multi-storey or multi-level homes there must be at least one smoke alarm on each level or storey.
- Who's responsible for replacing smoke alarm batteries? Tenants are responsible for changing batteries in smoke alarms that are designed to have the battery changed during their tenancy.
- Landlords are responsible for ensuring the smoke alarms are working at the beginning of every new tenancy.
